## Python regius



The Royal Python is the smallest of the African pythons; they have short tails and powerful, muscular bodies which they use - like all pythons and boas - to constrict their

prey.

The name royal python (from the Latin "regius") is based in part on the story that Cleopatra supposedly wore the

snake around her

wrist.



Left: Royal Pythons curl up in a ball with their head inside when they feel threatened, this is why they are also sometimes known as Ball Pythons.
