RUEPPELL'S GRIFFON VULTURE

Gyps rueppellii

Rueppell's Vultures leave the roost and using their exceptionally keen eyesight begin to patrol over the plains, to find large animal carcasses. If carnivores have made a recent kill they will wait, several days if necessary, until the carnivore leaves the carcass.

RECORD BREAKERS!!!

Using thermal currents, Rueppell's can reach great heights, 20,000 ft (6,000 m) is not uncommon, and on one exceptional occasion, a commercial aircraft collided with a Rueppell's Vulture at the astonishing altitude of 37,000 ft (11,300 m) - the current record for avian height.
