SOUTHERN GROUND HORNBILL

Bucorvus leadbeateri

Southern Ground Hornbills live in groups of up to 8 individuals usually with one dominant pair and several 'helper' males. Some females prefer a solitary life and will move away from the group to live on their own. Ground Hornbills are thought to be the only adult bird that plays.

Hornbills are known for 'walling up their mate' when incubating eggs leaving just a small hole for food to be dropped through, Ground Hornbills are the only hornbill

species not to do this.

FEMALE

When sexually mature a malesthroat is all red, the centre of the females throat is

dark blue.
